

Troop Terrific Patch Program

Purpose: To recognize girls and troops for their Girl Scout pride and assist volunteers and youth members in planning a balanced troop year by incorporating:

- GSEMA Safety Requirements
- The Girl Scout Leadership Experience
- Service Unit Engagement
- Girl Scout Program Materials, including Journeys and Girls Guide to Girl Scouting
- Girl Scout Product Program
- A Deeper Understanding of the Girl Scout Movement

This patch program is based on troop participation, rather than individual youth achievement. If the troop completes the activities, individual youth members are not excluded from earning the patch because they missed one or some of the activities.

Requirements: Troops accumulate points by completing activities below. A troop, community, GSEMA or service unit activity/event counts toward *only one* requirement. (Volunteer training can be counted every year.)

There are a total of 530 points, with those marked by a trefoil being required. Daisy troops must earn all required (215) points and Brownies or above must earn at least 350 points to qualify.

Patch: Available for purchase at the GSEMA shop. First time participants purchase the patch and subsequent year participants purchase rocker bars.
