- Evaluate your project and share your experience!

STEPS 5 and 6

Make a Plan and Do It!

- Do a 20 hour project. Planning hour can be counted towards the 20 hours.
- Complete "Make a Plan" worksheet
- Keep record of what you did for your project by pictures or short videos along the way.

You must complete the Bronze Award Report form found on our website, at www.hergirlscouts.org to a certificate of commendation and authorization to purchase the Bronze Award pin.

STEP 4 - Choose Your Bronze Award Project

- After you have finished exploring talk about what you saw that needed to be done in the community.
- This should lead to your Take Action Bronze Award Project.

STEP 2

Build Your Junior Team

- Going for the Girl Scout Bronze Award is a team experience. Decide as a group what you care about.
- It is okay if you have a couple of small groups working on a couple of Bronze Award Projects but no one girl should be working alone.

STEP 3

Explore your Community

- What is a community? A community is a group of people that share something in common. It could be your neighborhood your block or you school.
- Explore the communities around you and observe by looking and taking to people in that community. This will help with ideas of how you can help that community. Complete the Project Idea Chart.

STEP 1

The Journey

- Complete a Junior Girl Scout Journey and the Take Action project.

- The first four steps must be completed before the Girl Scout Bronze Award project is undertaken.
- A Bronze Award project may not raise money for another organization, cause or individual as stated in *Safety Wise* on page 76.
