

## Cohasset Girl Scout receives Gold Award

Girl Scouts of Eastern Massachusetts announced Cohasset Girl Scout Jennifer Curley received her Girl Scout Gold Award pin at a ceremony attended by family, friends and Girl Scouts of Eastern Massachusetts Chief Executive Officer Ruth N. Bramson and board President Peggy Stevens.

The Girl Scout Gold Award is the highest award a Girl Scout can achieve, awarded for fulfilling a need within a girl's community, whether local or global, and creating ongoing change. The project encompasses organizational, leadership and networking skills. Only about 5 percent of all Girl Scouts earn this award each year.

For her "Girl Scout Women of Cohasset through the Years" project, Jennifer conducted interviews with community leaders whose lives were influenced by their involvement in Girl Scouts. The years reported on spanned from the 1900s to 2010 and the focus of the interviews was the teachings of Girl Scouting and giving back to the community. Curley later transcribed and showcased the interviews by creating a brochure that is on display at Cohasset Historical Society. Additionally, the exhibit included vintage uniforms and memorabilia. Overall, her project was a great way to utilize her Girl Scouting experience to bridge various generations within her community.
